
FELLOWSHIP LUNCH

MOLDOVA

Lance and Carol had the chance to have an extended video call with Andrei and Eugenia in Burlacu last Thursday. Our conversation was very wide-ranging. Generally, they are more positive about the situation in Ukraine than they were a couple of weeks ago and have said that TEN has already got some money through to them to help support refugees in the local area. However, prices are rising even faster in Moldova than they are here in the UK. Emma and her new husband are getting along really well in Chisinau. Livica, also studying in Chisinau, is talking about getting married in July at the tender age of 18. Adrian and Adriana are now at college in Cahul during the week, leaving a very quiet home in Burlacu. Andrei and Eugenia are working very hard in local schools, for 4 and 5 days each week respectively. They send their love and thanks to all of us and ask us to continue praying for their ministry.

FELLOWSHIP NEWS

Pauline Kelly's daughter, Kate - She has been very unwell as a result of a serious operation she had a while back and now most of her family has contracted covid. They have had a really tough few years so please pray for them all to know God's peace.

Ann Lewendon - Ann tripped badly down her stairs last week but is recovering at home.

Rebecca Mason - Last week she managed to walk a bit without her Zimmer although she still needs a siderail or an arm to lean on if necessary. The priority for her is now to do her exercises even when the physiotherapists aren't there!
